Discussion with Charles Canham of the ZBA on the failed passing of the Timber Harvesting Local Law (2018) – Jean

- NY DEC protects people's right to do forestry
- Look at NRI Map 15
- To enroll on 480-a you need 50 acres minimum and a DEC forest management plan. The law requires harvesting. The town gets some of the money from each harvest/stump; there hasn't been an active log sale registered with the town in several years.
- There has always been interest statewide in not requiring harvesting and there was a new law that would revise the tax law, but it didn't pass.
- Clearcutting is protected under DEC law. Town laws can't prohibit forest management, whether or not a parcel is under 480-a
- Towns can put in ordinances that limit cutting trees around houses, but nothing that interferes with farming or forestry.
- The cleaner the logging operation, the worse it is for the environment.
- There are a number of properties in town still under the Fisher Act but the state doesn't recognize it any longer.

Climate Smart Community Task Force – Joe

- Climate Smart Resiliency Planning
 - Dutchess and Columbia/Green CCE reached out and said Hudson River Estuary
 Program was looking for communities interested in doing Climate Smart Resiliency
 Planning so they could submit a grant for it. We said yes we would be interested.
- We have been approved for a \$10K NYSERDA grant to do the energy audit of the town highway garage. Energy audit will happen mid-January. They will provide us with a list of recommendations to make that facility energy efficient. The company that comes in from NYSERDA is based on the number of employees in that building/facility, and the cost is estimated to be \$4600. Joe has floated the idea of doing the old highway garage too, but is unsure they will do it. We can expect a report about a month after the audit.
- Joe was notified by NYSERDA we were eligible for a \$50K grant. He is working on the application. If we get it, we can use it as additional funds for implementing any recommendations from the energy audit.
